

General Rules and Regulations of the South Shore Bluegrass Music Association
~ Current as of March, 2024

1. No illegal drugs allowed on premises.
2. Keep vehicle speed under 15km/h for safety and dust control.
3. No pleasure riding of motorcycles, snowmobiles or all-terrain vehicles.
4. **Parking:** a) Units are permitted to be pulled through in the main center field, **“when the land is dry”**.
 - b) Units are permitted to be parked **“awning to awning”**.
 - c) Park far enough away from your neighbor to allow for awnings and “push-outs”.
 - d) The **center of the main field** is to be left clear.
5. a) When leaving the park after the weekend, mats and any other items must be taken up.
b) When leaving the park after the weekend, steps are to be put up and if possible, slides put in for mowing purposes.
6. Units must be moved to a different mowed spot every THREE weeks.
7. If unit is left unoccupied for longer than 21 days, it must be placed in the holding area. The designated area for this is behind the building , along the tree line and south toward the Samuel Mader Road. We are still required to move unit everyTHREE weeks. **The SSBMA will not be held responsible for said units.**
8. No charcoal barques.
9. Keep radio and stereo music, etc. at a reasonable volume so there is no interference with other members.
10. No loud parties or profanity.
11. Generators are not to be used between the hours of 1:00 am and 7:00 am, except for medical reasons or club functions. Unreasonable use of loud generators will not be tolerated.
12. Campfires are **not** allowed outside the main controlled fireplace.
Being a private park with camping privledges for members, fires at the main controlled firepit are permitted during a fire ban for warmth and/or cooking purposes, keeping in mind “Safety First”, **do not** leave campfire unattended.

13. No burning of garbage in the main controlled fireplace.
14. Garbage policy: We **must** take our garbage home with us and leave the park clean.
15. Power is not available except for medical reasons, one (1) weekend only at a charge of \$20.00 for the weekend. Please see a Director to get the power turned on. Power will be provided for sleep apnea one(1) weekend only at a charge of \$20.00 9pm to 9am.
16. (a) All pets being walked must be on a leash no longer than 15 ft.
(b) When not being walked, all pets must be confined within your campsite.
(c) **Pet owners must clean up after their own pets.** All pet waste must be collected and taken home, no matter where on the property it is dropped. Pet waste attracts rats and disease.
(d) We are responsible to inform our guests of the rules as well as to ensure that they clean up after their own pet.
(e) Do not allow barking dogs to disturb others.
17. Solicitation on the premises will not be permitted, unless approved by "Ways and Means".
18. VIDEO TAPING is permitted, with the consent of the performers.
(As of: Sept. 2021)
19. Non-member musicians, who will be playing for a show, may attend the park with partner and unit by special invitation of the Entertainment Committee.
20. Only acoustic instruments are to be used (except for electric bass guitar), unless approved by the Entertainment Committee.
21. Do not handle other people's musical instruments without their permission.
22. No alcoholic beverages are to be taken inside the building in original containers.
23. a) Members are encouraged to invite guests with units who could become prospective new members; said guests may attend **on two occasions ONLY**, (unless they become members) and must be accompanied by the inviting member. Our guests must be made aware of our rules and their responsibility to follow them.
b) Visiting family from away are permitted to camp (either with own unit or in member's unit) **on two occasions PER YEAR**. Our guests must be made aware of our rules and their responsibility to follow them.
c) If children or grandchildren are camping with a member in good standing they may attend SSBMA "Member's Only" functions.
MUST be accompanied by the inviting member.

24. Members and guests are requested to fill fresh water tanks prior to entering the park. If an RV runs out of water while staying at the park, fill-ups are ONLY AVAILABLE at the tap behind the building. Proceed down the hill and take the first road to the right. Water is non potable.

25. The "Catch Basins" that are found in different areas of the park, are to be used for dish water only.

26. The "dump station" has been designed for us to drive over the cement pad. Stop where the sewage comes out from the RV and is directly lined up with the dump station hole. Any spill would then be caught by the cement basin and cleaned off with the water hose available at the station. To avoid damage to the sewer hose please make sure to hang it up after use.

27. When entering the park with full black/grey tanks, there will be a \$7.00 charge to dump.

28. Fundraising projects are encouraged, but must be proposed to the Ways and Means Committee, or a director, who will then bring them to the attention of the Board of Directors for approval.

29. Any changes to park facilities must be proposed to the Building and Park Maintenance Committee, who will then bring them to the attention of the Board of Directors for approval.

30. The Board reserves the right to evict, without prior notice, for "just cause" anyone who creates a disturbance, is a nuisance, breaks park rules or commits a criminal offence, etc.) (As per BY-LAW #5 (e) A member can be expelled from the association for "just cause" by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire Board of Directors.)

31. The Board reserves the right to refuse admittance to members or guests who abuse park privileges.
